18 **CONVENE THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE**

19 **Tab 1. Goldstein, Harvey (Endorsement of: 20 Years Experience; Other State**
20 **License - Virginia 2007)**

21 Dr. Harvey Goldstein was not present.

22 Dr. Goldstein graduated with a Ph.D. in Learning and Behavioral Disorders. The program was
23 not accredited by the APA.

24 In regards to Endorsement based on 20 years Experience: Dr. Goldstein's education was non-
25 APA accredited and does not meet the requirements set forth in 490.006(1)(c) & 490.003, F.S.

1 In regards to Endorsement based on Other State License (Virginia 2007): Virginia allowed for
2 non-APA accredited programs. Questions arose concerning the internship requirements. The
3 post-doctoral experience requirement was also less than the required 2,000 hours for Florida.
4 Examination requirements met.

5 **MOTION:** Dr. Rafael Rivas-Vazquez moved to deny Dr. Goldstein's application for licensure
6 based on Endorsement of 20 Years Experience with the option to withdraw his application within
7 14 days of receipt of the Notice of Intent to Deny. Dr. Harry J. Reiff seconded the motion, which
8 carried 2/0.

9 **MOTION:** Dr. Rafael Rivas-Vazquez moved to deny Dr. Goldstein's application for licensure
10 based on Endorsement of Other State License with the option to withdraw his application within
11 14 days of receipt of the Notice of Intent to Deny. Dr. Harry J. Reiff seconded the motion, which
12 carried 2/0.

13 **Tab 2. Ariadna Montero Examination**

14 Dr. Ariadna Montero was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

15 Dr. Montero received an APA accredited education from Carlos Albizu University in Puerto Rico.
16 Her supervised experience was completed in Puerto Rico under a Psychologist licensed in
17 Puerto Rico. Based on a previous Board decision, Puerto Rico does not meet the requirement
18 of being one of the fifty states.

19 Following discussion, Dr. Montero waived the 90-day requirement for Board action on her
20 application. Board staff was instructed to provide Dr. Montero with more information on how to
21 file a petition for variance or waiver from Section 64B19-11.005(1)(c) F.A.C.. The Committee
22 provided suggested documentation, Supervisor's Curriculum vitae & educational documents, to
23 supplement the petition.

24 **MOTION:** Dr. Rafael Rivas-Vazquez moved to table Dr. Montero's application for licensure
25 based on Examination. Dr. Harry J. Reiff seconded the motion, which carried 2/0.

26 **Tab. 3 Rosamari Pena Examination**

27 Dr. Rosamari Pena was not present.

28 Dr. Pena applied by the Examination method. She received an APA accredited education from
29 Carlos Albizu University in Puerto Rico. Her supervised experience was completed in Puerto
30 Rico under a Psychologist licensed in Puerto Rico. *Based on a previous Board decision, Puerto
31 Rico does not meet the requirement of being one of the fifty states.*

32 Dr. Rosamari Pena provided written correspondence in the Board addendum to waive the 90-
33 day requirement for Board action on her application. Board staff was instructed to provide Dr.
34 Pena with more information on how to file a petition for variance or waiver from Section 64B19-
35 11.005(1)(c) F.A.C.. The Committee provided suggested documentation, Supervisor's
36 Curriculum vitae & educational documents, to supplement the petition.

12 **CONVENE THE CONTINUING EDUCATION COMMITTEE**

13 **Review of Application for Continuing Education Provider Status**

14 **Tab 1. D & S Associates**
15 **“Personality Disorders”**
16 **Course No.: 20 – 40623**

17 Mr. Patrick L. Dechello from D & S Associates was not present.

18 D & S Associates submitted an application and course sample materials for approval to become
19 a continuing education provider for Psychology. 7 General Credits were requested for the
20 “Personality Disorders” sample course. The provider also requested retroactive approval for this
21 course, beginning on September 14, 2011.

22 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to deny D & S Associates as a continuing education
23 provider for Psychology pursuant to Rule 64B19-13.004(1)(a) & 64B19-13.004(3), F.A.C., which
24 requires that continuing psychological education courses must enhance psychological skills and
25 knowledge. Dr. Luis E. Orta seconded the motion, which carried 2/0.

26 Following the motion, committee members offered that if the provider wanted to submit a
27 request for reconsideration, additional information on its continuing education program needed
28 to be provided: Pg 15 – information explaining Etiology #4, apparent contradiction on Slide 9
29 with Slide 34, 54 & 63, & that it does not exceed basic level of undergraduate instruction.

30 Upon expectant reconsideration of course, committee noted retroactive approval may be
31 received, provided that the licensees who previously completed the course had access to
32 necessary supplemental material, as noted by the committee.

2 **“The Efficacy, Effectiveness and Dissemination of Prolonged Exposure**
3 **(PE) Therapy for PTSD”**
4 **Course No.: 20 – 336916**

5 Ms. Heather Clark from Florida Gulf Coast University - Counseling & Psychological Services
6 was not present.

7 Florida Gulf Coast University - Counseling & Psychological Services has submitted an
8 application and course sample materials for approval to become a continuing education provider
9 for Psychology. 6 General Credit hours were requested for the “The Efficacy, Effectiveness and
10 Dissemination of Prolonged Exposure (PE) Therapy for PTSD” sample course.

11 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to approve Florida Gulf Coast University - Counseling
12 & Psychological Services as a continuing education provider for Psychology. Dr. Luis E. Orta
13 seconded the motion, which carried 2/0.

17 Ms. Elinor Robin from Mediation Training Group was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

18 Mediation Training Group has submitted an application and course sample materials for
19 approval to become a continuing education provider for Psychology. 40 General Credit hours
20 were requested for the “Family Mediation Training” sample course. The provider also requests
21 retroactive approval for this course, beginning on November 12, 2011.

22 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to approve Mediation Training Group as a continuing
23 education provider for Psychology. Dr. Luis E. Orta seconded the motion, which carried 2/0.

26 **Course No.: 20 – 328637**

27 Ms. Petra Jones from Mental Health Association of Southwest Florida was not present.

28 Mental Health Association of Southwest Florida has submitted an application and course
29 sample materials for approval to become a continuing education provider for Psychology. 1
30 General Credit hour was requested for the “Dementia” sample course. The provider also
31 requests retroactive approval for this course, beginning on September 22, 2011.

32 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to approve Mental Health Association of Southwest

27 **DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS**

28 **Assistant Attorney General, Donna McNulty** provided a briefing of a recent decision
29 regarding costs, Georges v Department of Health, Board of Nursing. Ms. McNulty reviewed the
30 statutory requirements for Itemized costs and documentation that is required in regards to
31 disciplinary fines.

32 **MOTION FOR DETERMINATION OF WAIVER AND ENTRY OF FINAL ORDER**

33 **Tab 1. A. Norman Goldwasser, Case No. 2010-16029 (p/c/p Amy Swan, Luis Orta, &**
34 **Ana Martin-Lavielle)**

35 Dr. Goldwasser was not present, and was not represented by counsel.

36 Dr. Luis Orta was recused based on participation in the probable cause process

1 Dr. Goldwasser was charged with violating Section 490.009(1)(t), F.S. (2010) by violating an
2 order of the Board or Department previously entered in a disciplinary hearing when he failed to
3 timely complete 12 hours of continuing education units pursuant to the Final Order in case
4 number 2004-27669, Department of Health vs. Norman Goldwasser..

5 **MOTION:** Dr. Harry Reiff moved that the administrative complaint was properly served on the
6 respondent. Dr. Dean Aufderheide seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

7 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved that the respondent failed to respond to the
8 administrative complaint and has waived his right to elect a hearing. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded
9 the motion, which carried 3/0.

10 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to adopt the findings of facts alleged in the
11 administrative complaint. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

12 **MOTION:** Dr. Harry Reiff moved that the findings of fact support a violation of the Florida
13 Statute. Dr. Dean Aufderheide seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

14 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide that the respondent is in violation of the Florida Statutes, as
15 charged in the administrative complaint. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

16 **MOTION:** Dr. Harry Reiff moved to accept into evidence the investigative file for the purposes of
17 determining a penalty and request an opportunity to make a penalty recommendation following
18 this action on the suggestion. Dr. Dean Aufderheide seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

- 19 • Fine in the amount of \$1,000 payable within 30 days of the filing of the Final Order
20 • Suspension until outstanding 12 continuing education credits are completed from final order
21 issued in 2009.
22 • Additional 3 hours of continuing education in Laws and Rules within 3 months.

23 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to accept the Department's recommendations as
24 outlined. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

25 **MOTION:** Dr. Harry Reiff moved to access costs related to investigation and prosecution of this
26 case in the amount of \$1,042.15, and to reserve jurisdiction to bifurcate the cost issue at a later
27 Board date. Dr. Dean Aufderheide seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

28 **MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER ADOPTING SETTLEMENT**

29 **Tab 2. Natalie M. Stamey, Case No. 2011-07949 (p/c/p Amy Swan, Luis Orta, & Ana**
30 **Martin- Lavielle)**

31 Dr. Natalie M. Stamey was present and sworn in by the court reporter.
32 Attorney, Mr. James Meyer, was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

33 Complainant was not present.

34 Dr. Luis Orta was recused based on participation in the probable cause process

1 Dr. Stamey was charged with violating Section 490.009(1)(l), F.S. (2010), by making
2 misleading, deceptive, or fraudulent representations related to practice by identifying herself as
3 a licensed clinical psychologist with the intent to lend credence to assertions not supported by
4 evidence. Dr. Stamey was also charged with violating 490.009(1)(r), F.S. (2010), for failing to
5 meet the minimum standards of performance in professional activities when measured against
6 generally prevailing peer performance, including the undertaking of activities for which the
7 licensee is not qualified by training or experience, by making a diagnosis based on limited
8 interaction in one brief encounter instead of using a psychological interview or standard test.

9 Dr. Harry Reiff stated his knowledge of Dr. Stamey thru affiliation with the Florida Psychological
10 Association, however did not feel this would bias his judgment in this case.

11 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to reject the Department's Settlement Agreement. Dr.
12 Harry Reiff seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

13 **MOTION:** Following discussion, Dr. Dean Aufderheide proposed a counter-offer. Dr. Harry Reiff
14 seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

15 **COUNTER OFFER:**

- 16 • Evaluation by Professionals Resource Network, Inc. (PRN)
- 17 • Suspension, which is stayed pending an evaluation of the respondent by the Professionals
18 Resource Network (PRN). The Board reserves jurisdiction to set other terms and conditions
19 of probation at the next meeting following receipt of the PRN evaluation report.
- 20 • Respondent is required to be under indirect supervision pending the results of the PRN
21 evaluation. Terms of the initial period of indirect supervision are as follows:
 - 22 ▪ Approval of the supervisor is delegated to the Chair. Respondent is to submit
23 three (3) curriculum vitas (CVs) of psychologists licensed in the same area of
24 practice with which there are no financial or personal conflicts of interest.
 - 25 ▪ Supervisor is to review 100% of client records in the respondent's practice.
 - 26 ▪ Respondent's practice, during the initial period of indirect supervision, is
27 restricted to disallow provision of services to clients that are male patients with
28 anger management or domestic violence issues.
- 29 • Original continuing education requirements from original settlement agreement are retained
30 with note that home study courses are not permitted.
- 31 • Fine of \$4,000 from original settlement agreement is retained.

32 The Board agreed to accept the Respondent's payment of \$1,100, made prior to the Board
33 meeting, as payment of costs in this case. The Board was also made aware that Dr. Stamey
34 had previously remitted payment of the fine in this case.

35 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to accept the counter-offer. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded
36 the motion, which carried 3/0.

37 The Department accepted the Board's counter-offer.

39 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to modify counter offer to read, "Suspension stayed
40 pending Professionals Resource Network (PRN) evaluation results stating, respondent can

1 practice psychology with reasonable skill or competence.” Dr. Harry Reiff seconded the motion,
2 which carried 3/0.

3 The Department and Dr. Natalie Stamey’s attorney, Mr. James Meyer, accepted the counter
4 proposal.

5 **Tab 3. Patricia B. Wilmoth, Case No. 2008-08922 (p/c/p Rafael Rivas-Vazquez,**
6 **Carol Webster, & Herbert Goldstein)**

7 Dr. Patricia B. Wilmoth was present and sworn in by the court reporter.
8 Attorney, Mr. Robert Potter, was present.
9 Complainant was not present.

10 Dr. Rafael Rivas-Vazquez was recused based on participation in the probable cause process

11 Dr. Wilmoth was charged with violating 490.009(1)(r), F.S. (2006,2007) for failing to meet the
12 minimum standards of performance in professional activities when measured against generally
13 prevailing peer performance, including the undertaking of activities for which the licensee is not
14 qualified by training or experience, by failing to adequately terminate services and refer patient
15 to a psychologist, and by having a financial conflict of interest with patient by paying patient for
16 the upkeep of horses.

- 17 • Reprimand
18 • Fine in the amount of \$1,000 payable within 12 months of the filing of the Final Order
19 • Costs in the amount of \$6,005.71 payable within 12 months of the filing of the Final Order
20 • 12 hours of continuing education, with 3 hours on Laws and Rules, 6 hours on assessment
21 and treatment of Axis II disorders, and 3 hours in ethics and boundary issues.
22 • Submission of an affidavit within 30 days of the filing of the final order attesting to the study
23 and understanding of the Florida laws and rules governing the practice of psychology.
24 • No service as “Qualified Supervisor” until the respondent has complied with all of the
25 obligations of Final Order.

26 Following discussion, Dr. Harry Reiff offered technical changes to Department’s Settlement
27 Agreement with regards to the continuing education requirements and to pay costs within 12
28 months of the filing of the Final Order.

29 The Department and Dr. Patricia B. Wilmoth agreed to amend the settlement agreement,
30 referencing Mental Health Counselor with Psychology, and the offer of costs to be payable
31 within 12 months of the filing of the Final Order.

32 **MOTION:** Dr. Luis Orta moved to accept the Settlement Agreement with the oral amendments.
33 Dr. Dean Aufderheide seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

34 **Tab 4. Kenneth Lamar Long, Case No, 2008-16794 (p/c/p Amy Swan, Luis Orta, &**
35 **Ana Martin-Lavielle)**

36 Dr. Kenneth Lamar Long was present and sworn in by the court reporter.
37 Attorney, Ms. Suzanne Brownless, was present

38 Dr. Luis Orta was recused based on participation in the probable cause process

1 Dr. Long was charged with violating Section 490.009(1)(w), F. S. (2006) by violating Section
2 456.013(1)(a), F.S. (2006) when he failed to supplement his provisional psychologist license
3 application by failing to disclose to the Board that he was under investigation for practicing
4 psychology without a license. As well as violating Section 490.009(1)(w), F. S. (2006) by
5 violating rule 64B19-1(2)(a), F.A.C. when he entered into a supervisory relationship with an
6 individual whom he had a familial relationship.

7 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to reject the Department's original Settlement
8 Agreement. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded the motion, which carried 3/0.

9 **MOTION:** Dr. Dean Aufderheide moved to accept all the original terms and conditions of the
10 original Settlement Agreement with exceptions. Dr. Harry Reiff seconded the motion, which
11 carried 3/0.

12 Exceptions:

- 13 • Amended Administrative Complaint
- 14 • Reprimand
- 15 • Fine in the amount of \$10,000 payable within 48 months of the filing of the Final Order
- 16 • 3 additional continuing education hours in supervisory relationships for mental health
17 providers
- 18 • Probation for 3 years which consists of 3 years of supervision with the following terms and
19 conditions:
 - 20 • With respect to the supervisor:
 - 21 ▪ Delegation to the chair, temporary approval of the supervisor. 3 CVs must
22 be submitted in the same area of practice with no dual relationships or
23 personal conflicts of interest.
 - 24 ▪ Appearance of respondent and supervisor before the Board at the first
25 meeting following the commencement of the period of probation, and an
26 appearance at the last meeting of the Board prior to the termination of
27 probation.
 - 28 • Year 1 of supervision, with review of 75% of patient records; once every 2 weeks for
29 the 1st 3 months with monthly reviews thereafter at the supervisor's discretion.
 - 30 • Year 2 of supervision, with review of 50% of patient records; with monthly reviews
31 thereafter at the supervisor's discretion.
 - 32 • Year 3 of supervision, with review of 25% of patient records; with monthly reviews
33 thereafter at the supervisor's discretion.

34 Respondent has 14 days to accept or reject the Settlement Agreement.

35 Dr. Harry Reiff requests council to investigate possibility of discipline case under Dr. Kenneth
36 Lamar Long's full Psychology license # PY8295.

19 **Tab 6. Final Appearance Pursuant to Notice of Intent to Approve Licensure with**
20 **Conditions: Eric Reznik**

21 Dr. Eric Reznik was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

22 Supervising Psychologist, Dr. Rick A. Harris was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

23 During the September 2010 Credentials Committee conference call, the Board approved Dr.
24 Reznik's application for licensure under conditions, requiring direct supervision for 1 year.
25 Dr. Reznik and his proposed supervisor, Dr. Harris, appeared before the Board for Dr. Harris'
26 supervisory role approval during the January 2011 General Business Meeting. The motion to
27 accept Dr. Harris as supervisor was approved.

28 Pursuant to the Board's Notice of Intent to Approve Licensure with Conditions, filed 10/29/2010,
29 prior to termination of the supervision, the supervising psychologist submitted quarterly reports
30 regarding the supervisory period and was present with the licensee at the final Board meeting.

31 **MOTION:** Dr. Luis E. Orta moved to approve lifting the conditions on Dr. Eric Reznik's license.
32 Dr. Dean Aufderheide seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.
